Who is the Kinsmen Foundation? Who do we help?

Learn about the **History of TeleMiracle** on our website, telemiracle.com and what inspired a group of like-minded individuals in Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs to dedicate their lives to providing specialized mobility and medical equipment and medical travel assistance to the people of Saskatchewan, improving their quality of life and independence. Their dream resulted in the Kinsmen Foundation, a volunteer-driven organization who has held the annual telethon since 1977.



Funds raised at TeleMiracle assist
Saskatchewan residents of ALL ages, who apply to the Kinsmen Foundation for financial assistance. Is there someone in your school, family or neighborhood who has received funding for a walker or bike to improve their mobility?

We also receive requests for big-ticket items such as

power wheelchairs, van conversions to make them wheelchair accessible, as well as travel, meals, and accommodation to access medical treatment. For the recipients of these gifts, it is like a miracle! One such miracle occurred at John Dolan School in Saskatoon, when the Kinsmen Foundation helped to fund an accessible/sensory playground.

The miracles are varied, but the goal is always the same—to have a direct, positive affect on each recipient's quality of life. Every dollar raised helps our friends and neighbours! Last year, thanks to help from Saskatchewan teachers, students, and schools, together, we raised \$5,523,472!

How does fundraising impact your community?

Every year we receive about 1,000 applications for funding and we hear back how funds raised impact people in your community. Recipients are thankful for the freedom it gives them to participate in everyday events, like riding a bike or playing on a playground. Thanks to fundraising from schools around the province, Brighton and The John Dolan School playground were great examples of kids helping kids. Stories, such as these ones, range from newborn babies to the young and young at heart. There are lots of examples on our website and YouTube channel.

Ten year-old Brighton and his family are still looking for a diagnosis. All they know is Brighton's muscles are not developing as they should. Even though he is improving every day, Brighton has difficulty walking. Riding a regular bike would be impossible. Through your donations to Telemiracle, Brighton received a special tricycle, built just for him! He uses the trike to get around the hallways at his school and takes the trike home so he can ride around outside with his brother. The trike has helped him be a bigger part of his school community. 
We have also developed a Kickoff Event you can host right in your classroom, or during a school wide assembly, once they are allowed again. Check them out on the website.

Bursaries available for graduating students!

The Kinsmen Foundation is pleased to be the administrator of the Effie Close and Andrew Jamault Bursaries. Both Ms. Close and Mr. Jamault bequeathed estate funds to the Kinsmen Foundation to establish these bursaries. As the donors directed, the bursaries are to be awarded to a full-time student who has graduated grade 12 in Saskatchewan and is confined to a wheelchair. Each bursary is valued at \$2000.

The student may be in any year of any discipline or program and must be a resident of Saskatchewan. Selection will be at the sole discretion of the Kinsmen Foundation and will be based on demonstrated financial need and academic achievement (which may be based on the nature and extent of the disability). Applications are to be submitted by December 1 of each year to the Kinsmen Foundation office. More bursary info is available on our website!

Calling All Filmmakers! The Video Contest is returning!


Last year, we introduced a brand-new annual video contest for students ages 8 to 18!

Saskatchewan Talent

During auditions that take place each Fall, approximately 80 acts are selected from all areas of the province. Any family-friendly performance, such as singing, dancing, juggling, playing an instrument, etc., is considered. We know Saskatchewan schools are overflowing with talent and TeleMiracle is a great way for them to showcase their talent while helping those in need.

Have you considered having your schools choir or other groups audition for the show? Our Saskatchewan Talent performs throughout the telethon which is broadcast on CTV Saskatchewan and live streamed on our website. We also have Saskatchewan Talent performing during the Countdown to TeleMiracle, which is live streamed to our YouTube channel and on our website, during the couple hours leading up to the main broadcast. Please note that due to COVID-19, all performances during TeleMiracle will be prerecorded. This year's auditions will take place on October 17th in Regina and October 24th in Saskatoon, if you would like to audition in person. The cutoff date for applications is a week prior to each audition or whenever all the spots fill up, whichever comes first. New this year, we are also accepting auditions via video. Tote Boards

This is for students in grades 9 to 12. Normally, teams are selected from across the province to put up the totals during the telethon. Teams can wear their school jerseys to show their school pride. It is a great way for teens to get actively involved in TeleMiracle, promote their school, see what goes on behind the scenes, and get their 15 minutes of fame on television.
